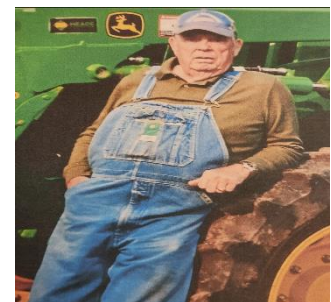
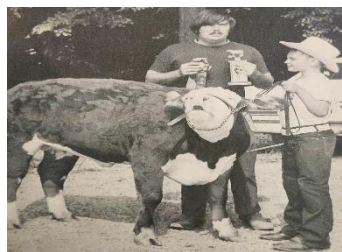

General Fair Information

2026 Sevier County Fair – Rules & Regulations

- Thank you for visiting the Sevier County Fair. We really hope you have a safe and fun experience while you are with us! A few rules must be adhered to, as with any event. The Sevier County Fair Association reserves the right to change any and all rules due to acts of God, such as excessive rains or causes not within the power of the management's control.
- **No animals will be permitted on the grounds during open fair hours except for Livestock show animals and service animals. On Saturday, September 5th, dogs will be permitted for the Sevier County Animal Care Center Woofstock event.**
- Every animal and article for exhibit on the Fairgrounds shall be under the control of the Sevier County Fair Association.
- While every precaution will be taken for the safekeeping of all exhibits/animals, the Sevier County Fair Association will in no case be responsible for any loss, escape, damage, or accidents that may occur.
- No alcoholic beverages are allowed on the Sevier County Fairgrounds.
- No disorderly conduct of any kind will be permitted. No trespassing on the grounds or otherwise fraudulently gaining admission will be tolerated. All violators will be arrested and prosecuted. No person or persons will be allowed to remain on the Fairgrounds

during the night, except Security, Sevier County Fair Association Officials, and those given special permission from the Association.

- All vehicles brought onto the Sevier County Fairgrounds are at the risk of the owner. The Sevier County Fair Association will not be responsible for vehicles or any part of their contents. Vehicles must be parked outside the gates on the Fairgrounds one hour before opening time each day and are not allowed back in until the grounds are officially closed each night.
- Any child 10 years of age and younger must be accompanied by an adult to enter the Fairgrounds.

RAIN CHECKS CANNOT BE ISSUED

To All Sevier County Fair Exhibitors

- Refer to the calendar for entry dates & deadlines. All exhibits must remain on exhibit throughout the Fair. Exceptions are livestock and dogs, which will be on the grounds the day they are shown. Pre-registration is encouraged, and entry forms may be filled out online at www.seviercountyfair.org. Premiums will be paid by check. Premium checks will be available on or after the first day entries are available for pick-up. Check the schedule for dates. **Checks are void after 60 days; checks older than 60 days will not be honored. Sorry, NO exceptions. No checks can be reissued after the 60-day cut-off.**
- Unless otherwise noted, exhibitors may not enter more than one entry in any one lot. All entries must be made by, owned by, created by, or grown by the person whose name is on the entry form. Any violation will disqualify the entry. Store-bought items will not be judged. Any person who enters FIVE OR MORE ENTRIES will receive ONE FREE exhibitor pass, which is good for ONE FREE ADMISSION ONLY from September 1st – September 4TH and September 7TH **(all dates except rodeo dates)**. If the FREE exhibitor pass is used on Saturday, September 5th or Sunday, September 6th there will be an \$8 upcharge **(Rodeo Days)**.
- The right is reserved to withhold the prizes awarded in any case in which it appears to the Fair that the regulations have not been followed or that fraud or deception has been attempted, or when the article is not deemed worthy; the Fair's decision shall be final and binding. When articles are not deemed worthy, judges will refuse to award premiums. It is not the policy of the Fair to distribute premiums equally among exhibitors, and no premiums shall be awarded to any article that does not possess high intrinsic merit.
- Our judges are selected with the utmost care. Exhibitors are not allowed in the vicinity during show judging. Only judges and fair workers may be present at the time of judging. Exhibitors may only enter the Exhibit Hall once the fair opens to the public on September 1st at 5:00pm.
- While we do have Security in the Exhibit Hall and on the grounds, exhibit entries of any kind, in any department, are at the owner's risk. The Sevier County Fair Association assumes no responsibility whatsoever.
- Your exhibits need to arrive ready to display, with **no special handling or setup by our volunteers.**
- The Exhibit Hall is **NOT** open for viewing exhibits until the fair opens to the public.
- You do not have to be an adult to enter exhibits in the adult departments. These departments are open to all ages; however, you will be competing against adults.
- The base of any exhibit item cannot exceed 18"x18" due to display shelf sizes.
-  This icon indicates a **NEW** exhibit item for 2026.
-  This Tri-Star indicates an exhibit item that may be eligible to go to the 2027 State Fair in Wilson County if the item places 1st. Anyone eligible will be notified.
- Physical ribbons are available upon request for 1st – 3rd place winners when you pick up your items.

However, if they are used on Sept. 5th & Sept. 6th (**Rodeo Dates**) there will be an upcharge of \$8.00 (**unless the ticket specifies Rodeo Included**). Parking is FREE. UNLIMITED RIDE WRISTBANDS are \$25 each regardless of age. Individual ride tickets are available for purchase. (Ride wristband and ticket prices are subject to change.)

Sevier County Fair Livestock Show – General Rules & Regulations

Policy Change – Cattle for all shows must be in place by 3:00pm.

- 1) No animals will be admitted to the Fairgrounds without a "Certificate of Veterinary Inspection" (health papers).
- 2) No exhibitors will be allowed more than (2) animals per lot.
- 3) Entry fee is \$15.00 per head for Open Dairy & Open Beef Show. Extra Tie spaces are \$10.00 each (Limit 1).
- 4) Premiums & Ribbons are given for 1st - 5th places.
- 5) Dairy cattle need to be in place by 3:00pm Monday, Sep. 7, 2026.
- 6) Junior Beef Show/Commercial cattle need to be in place by 3:00pm Tuesday, September 1, 2026.
- 7) Open Beef Cattle needs to be in place by 3:00pm Wednesday, September 2, 2026.
- 8) All Dairy & Beef Cattle **MUST** be registered unless they are exhibiting in the Commercial Class.
 - A) Commercial Heifers will be assigned to a class based on hip height measurements regardless of breed.
 - B) Commercial Heifers must have their "Milk Teeth" and be weaned.

Heifers must be owned by exhibitors and under their care and management by May 1 of the current year, according to rules regarding Junior Heifer Shows. Exhibitors will not be allowed to show more than four (4) animals in the commercial show. Heifers will be assigned to a maximum of 5 lots based on hip height measurements. Heifers shown in the Commercial show are not eligible to be shown in the registered show. Registered animals will not be allowed to show in this show. Entries for this show must be submitted on a special entry form found online at seviercountyfair.org. Heifers must be permanently identified by a legible tattoo in both ears and ear tags.

- 9) **Juniors do NOT have to be in 4-H to show their animal.** Juniors only need to be able to show and control their animal without any assistance from anyone else. Juniors will be eligible to show until the end of the calendar year following their graduation from high school or on their 20th birthday, whichever comes first.
- 10) Junior exhibitors will show their own animals unless they have (2) animals in the same class. The second animal must be shown by a junior.
- 11) Dairy Cattle, Junior & Open Beef Cattle will be released to tie out or leave the fairground at 9pm following their respective shows.
- 12) Exhibitors will be responsible for providing their own shavings.
- 13) Cattle must be tied in stalls with halters and neck ropes no longer than 3ft. To show, your cattle must be tied in the barn unless there isn't enough room.
- 14) Cattle must be washed in designated wash area.
- 15) **Safety:** Everything possible will be done to prevent accidents; However, if any should occur, neither the Sevier County Fair, nor Fair Personnel, nor others connected with the management of Sevier County Fair assumes any liability, either legal or otherwise to person or property.

Code of Ethics

Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, or show officials before, during or after the competitive event is prohibited. The Sevier County Fair Association reserves the right to withhold prizes awarded and/or reserves the right to ask an offender to leave the premises, in any case in which it appears to the Sevier County Fair Association, or its management team, that an exhibitor/fairgoer is violating this Code of Ethics.

No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this Code of Ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this Code of Ethics.

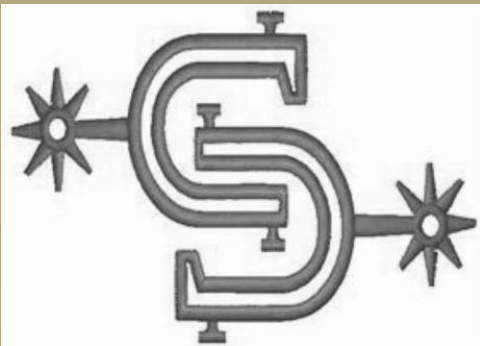

NO SICK GOAT will be allowed on the premises.**

*** There are no pen fees or goat entry fees; however, admission tickets must be purchased for all exhibitors and guests. If you have not purchased online, you will be required to pass through the main gates to purchase a ticket. Please see the website for entry forms and the mailing address.**

All entries are encouraged to be received by August 27th, 2026. However, late entries can be accepted.

Premiums and ribbons will be awarded in each class for 4 places. All goats will receive a ribbon. A trophy will be presented to the "Best Goat in Show."

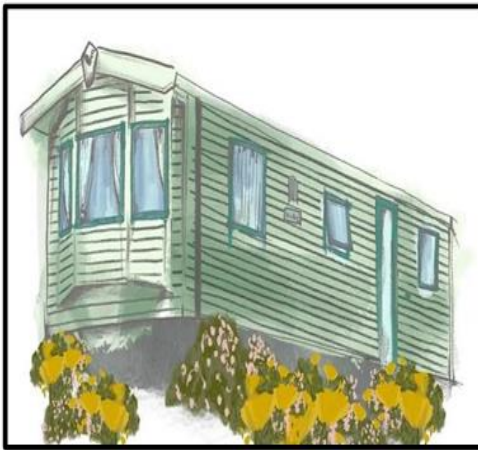
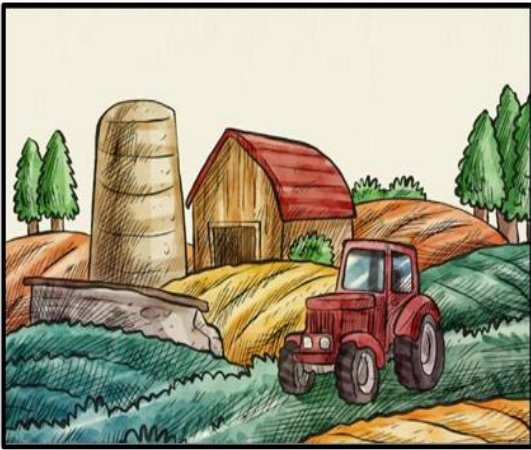

POULTRY SHOW GENERAL RULES

Crowing & Cackling at the Sevier County Fair

We invite chicken enthusiasts from all counties in Tennessee to look over their flocks and decide which birds would be the most likely to win “Best in Show” during the 2026 Sevier County Fair. Spruce them up and tote them down to the fair.

We encourage pure-bred poultry, but we will have a “mixed breed” bird class also. All birds entered will require a negative pullorum test within 90 days of the show. A state tester will be on hand the day of the coop-in to do such testing.

This is a NON-sanctioned FUN show with no exhibitor points being given to the American Poultry Association or American Bantam Association. There will be premiums for 1st - 3rd place honors as well as ribbons. If there are not at least 2 birds in a category, a 1st place ribbon will be paid second-place money.

ALL BIRDS MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED BY August 22nd, 2026.

The limit is due to limited space. To enter your poultry, please contact Angie at 865-414-8935 or Ruth at 865-414-7565. **THE ENTRY DEADLINE IS MONDAY, AUGUST 22nd, 2026. Birds must be cooped-in between the hours of 8am and 2pm on Saturday, August 29th, 2026.** All birds will be required to stay the entire week of the fair and will be fed and watered by our Experienced Barn Staff. The poultry tent will have every safety precaution taken, including a 6 ft. Chain-link fence surrounding the tent. Exhibitors will receive a ticket for one free entry to use on the day of their choice during the fair. The poultry exhibit will open to the public on Tuesday, September 1st, after judging has been completed. There is a \$2.00 entry fee per bird and \$1.00 clean-up fee.

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RABBIT SHOW GENERAL RULES

General Rules

- Entry fee is \$5 and includes the exhibitor's fair admission on show day. All others must pay fair admission to enter.
- Ideal show for a student's first exposure to showing an animal.
- This show is based on showmanship and the student's ability to handle and know the breed of the rabbit they are showing.
- To compete, students must meet all the requirements below:
 - Must be in grades 4th – 12th
 - Must have owned the rabbit they are showing starting June 1st
 - Must be able to bring their rabbit to the judge's table themselves
 - Must be able to tell the judges all about the breed of rabbit they are showing, including limited to:
 - Age, Breed, ARBA weight standard for the age and breed of the rabbit they are showing, uses of the specific rabbit breed, gender of rabbit
 - Must be able to perform a general health check on the rabbit in front of the judges, checking the rabbits:
 - Teeth, Gender, Feet Pads, Nose, Ears, and Condition of Body
- Rabbits are not competing against each other; students are competing on their ability to articulate and present their rabbit, its breed standards, and perform a general health check.
- The student's rabbit needs to be free of all illnesses and completely clean before showing.
- Any rabbit with signs of illness will be asked to be removed from the premises.
- Students must bring their rabbit in their own carrier/cage. There will not be housing for rabbits on site.
- Students enter this contest at their own risk, knowing that taking a rabbit into a public place can put it at risk for exposure to disease and illness.



Meat Pen

Students who want to participate in the meat pen auction will need the following:

- Three rabbits of the same commercial breed by July 26th that are approximately 6 weeks old at the time of possession.
- All three rabbits must be 12 weeks old (or close to it) by the show on September 6th
- Be entering 4th – 12th grade
- Sign up for the meat pen show by August 20th

Costume Show

Students wishing to participate in the costume show must do the following:

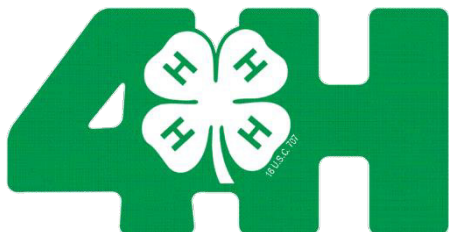

1. No animals will be admitted to the fairgrounds without "Certificates of Veterinary Inspection" (health papers).
2. Application for Junior show entry - entries must be made on regulation entry forms furnished by The Sevier County Fair. Entry Deadline: August 27th, 2026 - entry forms must be returned to the Sevier County Fair office. Entry Forms can be found on the Sevier County Fair website: **www.seviercountyfair.org**
3. **Fees: \$2 per head plus admission tickets at \$8 per person must be purchased for all exhibitors and guests before August 27th, 2026. If guests have not paid, they will be required to pass through the main gates to purchase tickets. * Please see the website for entry forms and mailing address.**
4. Junior Sheep must be in place by 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 3rd, 2026.
5. Junior competition is limited to either 4-H club members who were enrolled in the 4th grade or higher and FFA members who were enrolled in Vocational Agriculture on January 1st of the current year and have not reached the end of the calendar year of their high school graduation.
6. Junior exhibitors will show their own animals unless they have (2) animals in the same class. The second animal must be shown by a 4-H Club or FFA member.
7. All Junior Sheep must be registered unless exhibiting in the Commercial Ewe class.
8. Junior Sheep show order will be announced before the show. Junior Sheep show release times will be 9:00 pm following the show.
9. In cases where there is only one exhibit per lot or class, the exhibitor will receive 1st place ribbon and premium.
10. Junior exhibitors must comply with the Rules and Regulations of the Tennessee Department of Agriculture, and the Sevier County Fair General Rules for Sheep shows.
11. Safety: Everything possible will be done to prevent accidents; however, if an accident should occur, neither the Sevier County Fair, Fair Personnel or others connected with the management of Sevier County Fair assumes any liability, either legal or otherwise, to persons or property.
